Message from the President:

February 2023

Hope you are all having a healthy winter season and that all tournaments are going off as scheduled. The exciting news for this year is that it is the 100th year of the inception of the Golden Gloves organization and this year's National Tournament of Champions will be an Olympic Trials qualifier. With that in mind, it is very important that at the very beginning at the entry level of these tournaments that tournament directors make sure that the competitors in the Olympic weight divisions are US citizens. Legal, non-citizen/residents may compete only in the non-Olympic weight divisions. They will not qualify for the Olympics.

For US Citizens:

The Men's Olympic Weight Divisions are: 112 lbs, 125 lbs, 139 lbs, 156 lbs, 176 lbs, 203 lbs, 203+ lbs

The Women's Olympic Weight Divisions are: 110 lbs. 119 lbs. 125 lbs. 132 lbs. 146 lbs. 165 lbs

The legal non-citizen/residents may compete in the following divisions only: Men's 132 lbs, 147 lbs, 165 lbs Women's 139 lbs, 154 lbs, 178 lbs, 178+ lbs

All of the above weight divisions will be contested at all regional tournaments and at the National Tournament of Champions. In addition, all boxers must have at least 10 bouts in their passbooks to compete at the National Tournament of Champions.

I want to wish all participants the best of luck in the tournaments and I want to thank the countless volunteers who give their time to the Golden Gloves. I am so proud to be part of this great organization in the 100th year of "Making Champions & Good Citizens"!

Where Will They Come From?

Starting a boxing gym takes three key ingredients: a good sized building or room, a revenue stream, and someone possessing knowledge of how to teach boxing in a safe manner.

Finding the right building is always tough, finding a way to fund the program is a huge challenge, but finding someone willing to volunteer the necessary 700-1000 hours a year can be like climbing Mt. Everest naked.

That person also has to be skilled at communicating with young people, an armchair psychologist, a friend, parent, role model, promoter (for shows), and have the organizational skills of an entrepreneur.

It is my belief that the retired community could be our panacea. They possess hard earned life skills, are usually teachable, and have the available time. It is well known that after retiring, engaging in hobbies or social activities enhances one's mental wellbeing and cognitive function. Coaching boxing helps develop an alter-ego that was formerly defined by a job. Engagement in activities that give one a purposeful life can be the difference between a short life followed by death or a long vibrant life that allows you to share the wisdom and skills that you earned from decades of productive life in the workplace.

Having a reason to live gives you little time to die. You must retire to something, not from something.



How do we find these gemstones, these diamonds in the rough?

If you've coached for a long time, you have former boxers that you can call on and remind of all the time and effort you put into helping them, and now it's time for them to help you. I have two like this in my gym and they are magnificent because they already know what and how I coach so they hit the ground running. I also have another terrific helper that is a grandfather of one of my boxers. Ask your present boxers for help from their parents, grandparents, friends, etc.

I have given several talks in an attempt to recruit at retirement villages with some success. I have coach's recruitment business cards that I leave with folks I meet. It's like asking a girl to the prom. You may get a lot of nos but you only need one yes and you dance the night away.

KENDRA SAMARGIS

RESILIENCE AND PERSEVERANCE

Kendra Samargis at 29 years old found boxing a bit later in her life than many boxers. Picking up gloves initially to become a healthier version of herself, Samargis found she had some raw, natural talent and the heart of a champion. She wasn't about to let her relatively late start in the sport hold her back on any level.

The Twin Falls, Idaho, boxer began grinding, putting in the time and effort to make up for lost time. In no time at all she found herself on the Olympic track. No easy achievement for anyone!

Samargis began entering and winning USA Boxing Qualifying events and National events. After winning in 2022, Samargis earned a spot to train on Team USA at the Olympic Training Center in Colorado Springs. Camp was going well; Samargis took the grueling training schedule in stride with the focus on becoming a world class boxer. Ten days into camp something went terribly wrong and not according to the plans and goals Kendra had set for herself; she sustained a complete tear in her Achilles tendon. This is often a career ending injury for boxers.





Initially, Samargis was devastated and felt lost, but those feeling were short lived. Kendra gave herself one day of pity, and then with her signature resilience and perseverance she pulled herself together, had surgery on her ankle, and was back in the gym training in two days. Though physically limited, Samargis did every drill in every practice from a seated position in a chair. She credits this difficult time for providing her a gift. She took the time to concentrate on her hips and developing them for optimum power, something she never took the time to work on in detail before.



When asked what boxing means to her she will tell you, simply, that it means everything: "It's changed my life. I've grown so much through boxing. It gives people confidence and respect for themselves." She will also tell you one of the beliefs that she holds close to her heart is that: It doesn't matter when you start, it's how you're willing to give everything to something. I believe all goals can be accomplished."

Samargis has already earned herself a spot in the 2024 Olympic Trials. With her laser focus and phenomenal resilience and perseverance there's every possibility and probability that Samargis will box in the Olympics.

COACHING BOXING IS HIS HEART AND SOUL

Bob Goodwin has been in love with boxing his entire life. While working out at the YMCA the boxing bag was his go to. People were so intrigued that they stopped what they were doing to watch him do his thing.

They would gather around and ask about boxing technique. Regardless of where he was in his workout, he would always take the time to stop, explain, and demonstrate. It didn't take long before he had a regular group of kids and adults who would work mitts and bags with him. Bob works out A LOT and at several local gyms, so his following was significant.

Goodwin began scheduling regular workout times at the boxing gym, park, or wherever else he and his students could. Aspiring boxers would come early mornings to late evenings to gain knowledge, technique, and experience from him. For many of these kids this level of coaching would have been financially crippling. Bob understood this and made the decision that his services would be free of charge. Without his kindness many of these kids would never have access to a sport and may have succumbed to an at risk lifestyle.







One of Bob's boxers was moving out of state and was distraught that he would no longer have Bob in his corner. Goodwin reached out to a coach that agreed to take in the boxer, and Bob continues to check in with him and monitor his progress. The boxer is thriving in the sport thanks to Goodwin's efforts.

Bob continued his development as a coach and became a USA Boxing certified coach and is now a Silver Level coach. He just became registered as a coach for the Florida State Golden Gloves Championships at the Hard Rock Hotel and Casino in Hollywood, FL, this spring.

Bob Goodwin truly embodies the heart, soul, and spirit of amateur boxing. And while many of his boxers are grateful for the generous gift that they've been given, Bob would say that he is the one who has been given the greatest gift of all by being able to do what he loves most... coach.

DONTE LAYNE: AN INDOMNITABLE FORCE

Donte Layne dominated and swept his way through the tournament in the 165lbs division to become the 2022 Golden Glove Tournament Of Champions champion.

Layne, who also competes for team USA in the 175 lbs weight class, had to drop down in weight in order to compete in this tournament for the first time. He fought five times in six days and had to go back to training after each bout in order to make weight for the next day.

Despite this, he displayed a masterful performance in each bout and didn't lose a single round in the entire tournament winning every fight by unanimous decision

Layne was so dominant that some rounds were scored 10-8 in his favor even without scoring a knockdown or an eight-count.

Donte Layne was the only male from the New York Metro region to bring home the gold this year which is something he's extremely proud of.

Under the tutelage of his coaches Kenyatta Harris and Anthony Santiago, Layne is becoming one of the most dominant forces in amateur boxing today. His work ethic, strong mindset, and dedication have brought forth continued success. His focus is now locked in on qualifying for the olympics and representing Team USA and his home team Rockaway Ropes at the highest level.



"Ray Rodgers, known for his quick humor and his savvy lines, Rodgers' was a friend to many and a mentor to more inside and out of the Golden Gloves and Silver Gloves boxing communities.

Rodgers ran the National Silver Gloves as president from 1980 to 2020 and was president of National Golden Gloves from 2007-2017. Many credited him with being the heart and soul of Arkansas and national youth boxing for years, bringing many regional and national tournaments to the state.

Rodgers also was honored in the National Golden Gloves and Silver Gloves halls of fame, the Arkansas Sports Hall of Fame, where he told a local sportscaster, "The Arkansas Hall of Fame is as much fun as you can have with your clothes on", the Arkansas Sports Writers Hall of Fame and the Conway Sports Hall of Fame. He coached the USA Boxing Team three times.



"Coach Joe Guzman dedicated his life to helping countless youths, friends and family be the best they can be in and out of the ring."

Guzman was a life time resident of Fort Worth, Texas where he was loved by all. Joe was a great and admirable father, husband, grandfather, brother, uncle and coach. "Buddy Davis, was a pioneer in the world of amateur boxing, Buddy served as the President of the Georgia Amateur Boxing Association for 50+ years

Buddy served stateside in the United States Army during the Korean War. Later, he owned and operated a successful truck body manufacturing business, J.B. Davis & Son, with his father, and later his son. He was an active member of the community, serving as a Jaycee, where he held many local and state offices. His work as a Jaycee introduced him to the Boys Club of America, where he fell in love with the sport of boxing and founded the Georgia Amateur Boxing Association (GABA). Buddy served as the GABA president for 50+ years while pursuing his life-long quest of helping young men and women gain the tools they needed for successful and productive lives. Under his oversight, the GABA produced four US Olympian boxers, countless national champions and the former four time heavyweight boxing champion of the world. Additionally, Buddy held numerous national offices and served as team manager for several international competitions.


